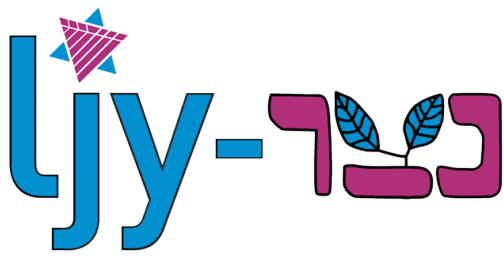

What is LJY-Netzer



LJY-Netzer is the youth movement of Liberal Judaism and a branch of Netzer Olami, the worldwide Progressive Zionist youth movement. We run a huge range of activities for 7 to 25 year olds, including summer camps, trips abroad, sleepover events, a 'gap year' programme, professional internships, social action events and much more.



As the youth movement of Liberal Judaism, our events are underpinned by Liberal Jewish values. Liberal Judaism is the Judaism of the past in the process of becoming the Judaism of the future. We believe in a modern and inclusive approach to our culture, seeking to preserve tradition in a way that is relevant for today. A strong emphasis is placed on the autonomy of the individual and their right to make informed decisions concerning Jewish beliefs and practices. People from a very wide range of backgrounds attend LJY-Netzer events.

Leaders

B'Shamayim is staffed by a fully-trained team of enthusiastic and dedicated volunteer youth workers all of whom having gone through extensive leadership training. Having grown up in LJY-Netzer themselves, the madrichim (leaders) know exactly what it's like to be a chanich/a (participant) on LJY-Netzer and are thus well placed to communicate effectively with your child/ren. The madrichim are the main point of contact for the chanichim on camp – they prepare and run all the activities and are always on hand to help with anything your child/ren may need. Upon arrival your child/ren will be introduced to their group leader – a madrich/a specially assigned to spend time with a group of chanichim sharing a room, and having primary responsibility for their welfare.

The madrichim on the camp are supported by a more experienced team of roshim (head leaders). Like madrichim, roshim are also volunteers on camp, but they hold some additional responsibilities for welfare, logistics and leadership support.

All our staff have an enhanced DBS and we strive to have a ratio of at least 1:3, 1:4 is our minimum.

Tom Francies, a professional youth worker & 3rd year movement worker is ultimately in charge. He is also first aid trained.

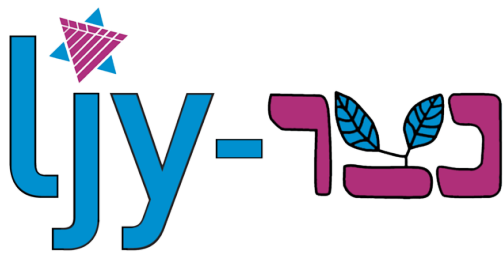
